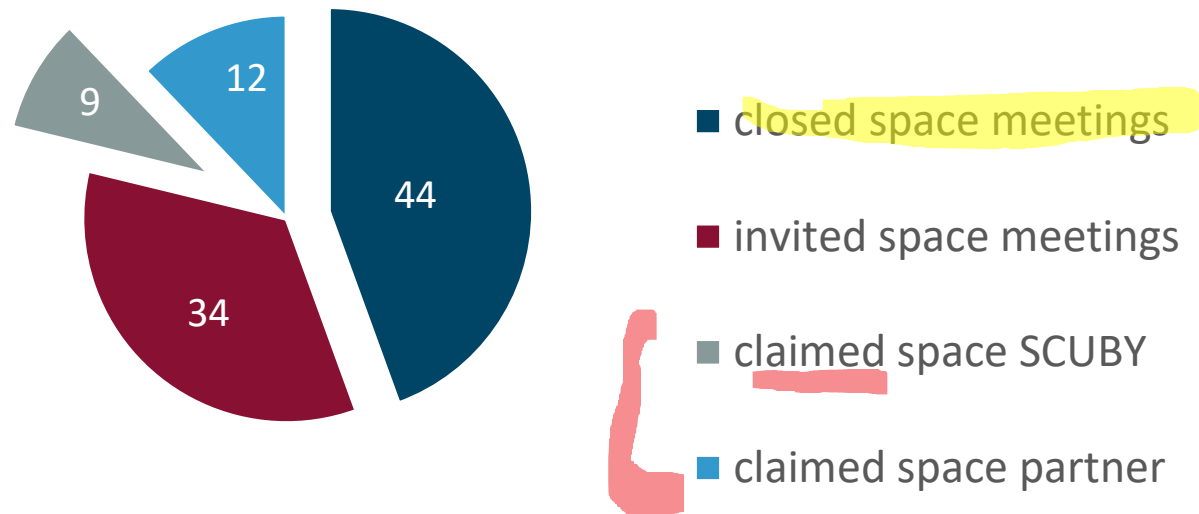
3 Research objectives

3. To examine progress on three axes

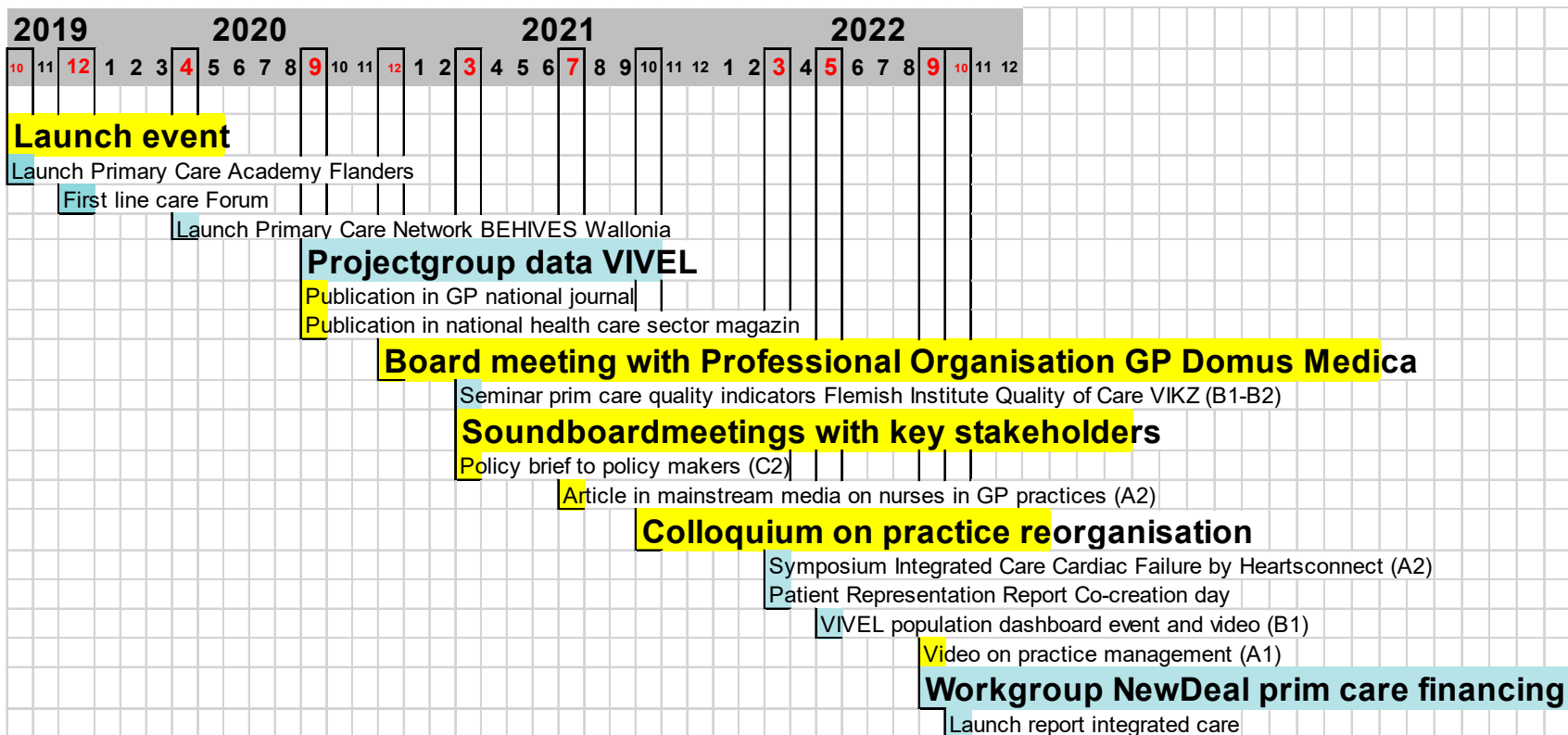

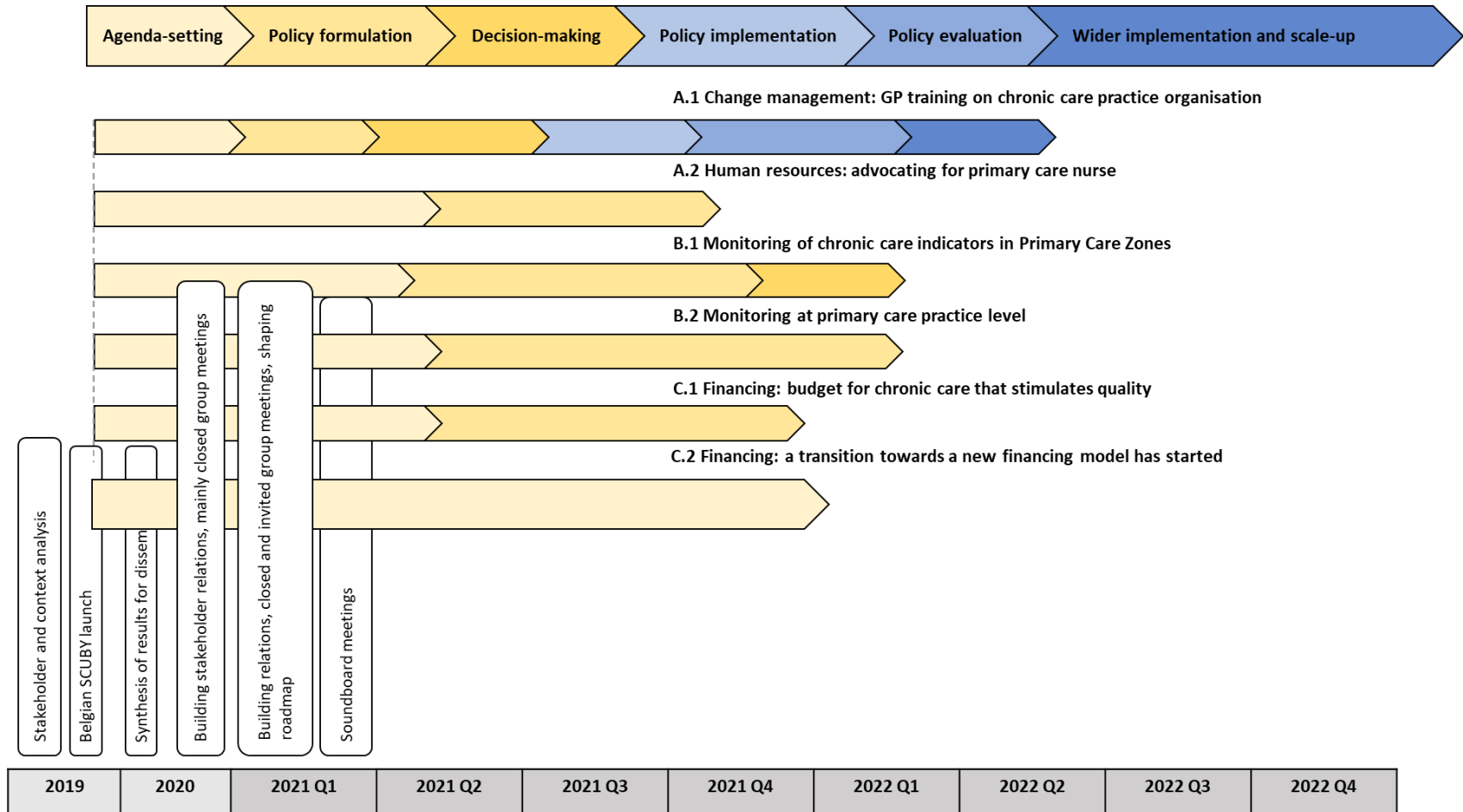

A. Practice organisation	Primary care practices have access to a step-by-step <u>trajectory</u> towards integrated chronic care	A modular support package for training and transition for primary care packages is developed	Two training trajectories
	Primary care practices know how to employ and deploy a nurse within their organization	An operational plan for integration of nurses in primary practices made and tested	No plan was made.
B. Monitoring process & outcomes chronic care	Universal set of <u>core indicators</u> for chronic care at primary care zone level is operationalised	Indicator set has been developed, tested and accepted by stakeholders	Consortium formed with data owners, processors, users and researchers to develop indicator set, mandate recognized by policy makers, resources allocated for development.

Limitations

- Focus on primary care



- Observer bias
- Validation of measure instruments
- Interplay of intervention and context limits attribution

Lessons

1. Policy dialogues:

- collaborative, networking approach
- build trust and buy-in
- creating synergies SCUBY – other projects
- understand context → anticipate change windows

2. Change teams:

- composition & capacity ~ credibility & potential
- agency is dynamic

3. Roadmaps:

- living document for communication - planning - monitoring, allows intervention plasticity

4. Variation in progress:

- ~ complexity of the (sub)system, agency of the change team
- ~ context elasticity => windows of opportunities.

5. Scale-up outcomes:

- Mostly on integration => as a condition for increasing package & coverage?
